Year of the Angelonia

This “summer snapdragon” thrives in heat and arid locations, making it a perfect choice for most summer gardens.

Angelonia is a genus of approximately 30 species, which grow natively in regions from Mexico to Argentina. The plants grow mostly upright, with stalks filled with flowers. Angelonia florets resemble tiny orchid-like blooms and their shape aids in pollination through hairs in the inner corolla that help bees forage for pollen. Angelonia thrives through most summer gardens with little extra maintenance or care.

Celosia 'Asian Garden'

- 2017 AAS Flower Winner
- This spiked beauty claimed victory in North America's trial sites to become the first ever AAS Winner from Japanese breeding company Murakami Seed. The judges gave this entry high marks in the greenhouse for the good branching, almost bushy growth habit and early to bloom flower spikes.
- In the garden, Asian Garden Celosia continued to bloom on sturdy stems, keeping the bright pink color all summer long, holding up even through some of the first frosts of the season. The AAS Judges commented on the fact that this celosia was a pollinator-magnet, making this AAS Winner a sure bet for pollinator-friendly gardens.

Nasturtium 'Tip Top Rose'

- 2020 AAS Flower Winner
- Tip Top Rose is a strong yet compact nasturtium with unique and showy rose-colored flowers showcased above medium green foliage. These 14×18” mounded plants were more floriferous than the comparisons varieties in the AAS trials, producing a bigger and better garden show. The uniquely colored flowers are a great addition to the nasturtium family especially since they don't fade as they age. Judges described the color as “a warm, bright rose with less of the black undertones typical in nasturtium flowers.” Tip Top Rose remained healthy throughout the season. It makes a great winter annual in warmer climates and a spring annual in other areas, whether used in containers or in the landscape. The whole plant stayed uniform and healthy whereas other varieties struggled. Bonus: This nasturtium is great for pollinator gardens and both the leaves and flowers are edible!

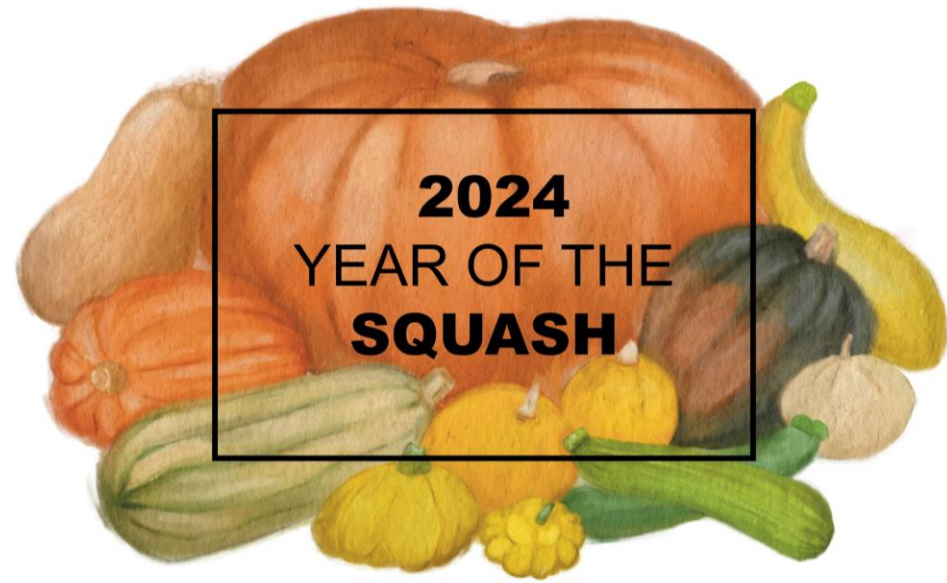

2024 Edible of the Year: Squash



Overview and History

Pumpkins, squash, and gourds have enchanted gardeners and foodies for generations with their diversity in shapes, colors, and flavors. Collectively referred to as “squash,” the Cucurbita genus has a rich history dating back over 8,000 years to Central and South America and 4,000 years later it was considered the primary agricultural crop of the ancients.

The indigenous people of the Americas included squash as a central component of the “Three Sisters” or “Trinity” planting system, which combined maize, beans, and squash to create a mutually beneficial ecosystem.

Squash was introduced to Europe in the late 16th century, and it quickly became a popular food crop there as well. Today, squash is enjoyed all over the world in both sweet and savory dishes.

Some squash varieties are grown primarily for their ornamental value, while others are used for a variety of practical purposes and delicious dishes.



Beet 'Bulls Blood'

- 64 days. The renaissance of the salad mix has made unique uses for all types of greens, and the leaves of Bull's Blood are a regal addition. The strong, deep red tops grow to 13 inches tall and have a clean crisp flavor. The 3–4 inch round roots have delightful red and white zoning. Harvest when small for the very best in eating quality.



Beet 'Burpee Golden'

- Heirloom
- Sweet, mild flavor with an inviting orange color.
- Burpee introduced this savory golden beet, a color breakthrough in the beet world, in the 1940s. Now, generations later, it remains an heirloom favorite. Gardener-chefs prize the 2" globes' sweet, mild flavor and golden glow. Delicious roasted, in soups, and in salads when complemented by grapefruit and red onion.

Broccoli 'Purple Magic'

- 2024 AAS Edible – Vegetable Winner
- This purple broccoli is magical! How else do you explain a broccoli that has it all? From its beautiful purple color, tight uniform heads and bright beads to its great broccoli flavor, this easy to grow broccoli is also stress and heat tolerant. A showstopper.
- “Wicked good! Nicest purple broccoli we’ve ever seen” exclaimed one very experienced edible judge.
- Excellent broccoli to try growing in cooler seasons. Can be eaten raw, stir-fried, roasted, lightly blanched, or steamed for the best texture, either way, you will find it sweeter and more tender than traditional green broccoli.





Carrot 'Atomic Red'

- 65 days. Open-pollinated Atomic Red gets its striking pigmentation from lycopene, a critical, disease-preventing precursor to beta-carotene. Raw, this Emperor-style Carrot is a unique, watermelon-red-purple color. Once steamed, cooked in soups and stews or roasted, Atomic Red's color darkens and its flavor deepens into a full, yummy Carrot taste. Harvest at a slim, 8" to 9" in length.



Cucumber 'Saladmore Bush'

- 2014 AAS Edible – Vegetable Winner
- Matures in 55 days from sowing. This semi-bush vine sets sweet crisp cucumbers as long as you keep them picked. Good garden performance due to the multiple disease resistances. Has dual use, pick small for processing as pickles and harvest larger for fresh slices or spears.



Eggplant 'Shikou'

- Shikou is a long Asian type eggplant with dark, glossy fruit that measure 6-8" long by 1-1.5 inches wide, have a purple calyx, very few seeds, thin tender skin, and a very white interior. Plants are medium-sized, productive, semi-spineless and mature about 75 days from transplant. Shikou is a Japanese word meaning "Supreme."



Pepper 'Basket of Fire'

- This little plant packs lots of punch!
- Prolific fruiting plant is loaded with small hot peppers in a compact size. It has good tolerance to cooler weather. Makes for beautiful Fall decor.

Pepper 'Red Impact'

- 70 days — Lamuyo-type peppers are notoriously difficult to grow, but the new Red Impact F1 variety is here to change that.
- This 2024 All-America Selections winning pepper is easy to grow and produces thick, sweet walls, even when green. It is also much sweeter than other varieties and loaded with fruit for a high yielding gem.
- Red Impact plants are upright and tidy, with a strong disease package.
- The fruit is dark red, highly uniform in shape and size.





Tomato 'Mountain Man'

- Grow extra-large, beefsteak-type tomatoes worthy of merchandising appeal! This meaty tomato with deliciously balanced sweetness and acidity is remarkable with its robust red color inside and out. A perfect match for the summer season of the mountainous southeast, this tomato is borne on early maturing and high yielding vines. 2024 Herb of the Year: Yarrow

- Common yarrow (*Achillea millefolium*) is the 2024 Herb of the Year™ of the International Herb Association. This hardy, native perennial with its dome-shaped clusters of tiny white flowers can be found along roadside and hiking trails as well as in home gardens. It will thrive in poor soil during dry periods and still produce blooms. It was introduced to America during colonial times and is considered a naturalized native plant.
- Yarrow pollen has been found in 60,000-year-old burial caves in Europe, indicating that humans have used it since prehistoric times. The genus *Achillea* refers to the Greek mythological hero of the Trojan Wars, Achilles, who used an extract from the plant to staunch the bleeding of warrior wounds. *Millefolium* comes from the Latin word for "thousand-leaved" in reference to the feathery-cut foliage. Common yarrow has many other names, such as soldier's woundwort, devil's nettle, and milfoil.
- The plant is a member of the aster (*Asteraceae*) or composite family and is common in Europe and Asia. There are many yarrow species and hybrids with a variety of traits that make it popular in ornamental flower gardens. Flowers are typically white but come in pink, red, cream, and yellow. Plants can have foliage as low as six inches or grow as tall as six feet, while others are medium height with strong, erect stems suitable for containers.
- Common yarrow is a perennial in USDA Hardiness Zones 3-9 and thrives in sun but can tolerate shaded areas. It does well in average soil and is drought-tolerant. The flowers grow upward in clusters to form a densely flowered bloom at the top of the plant, blooming from April to October. The foliage is green, with deep-cut leaves that extend to the ground and may become weedy. Growing upright 2-3 feet tall and spreading to 3 feet, it is best placed near the back of ornamental gardens and may need to be staked in windy areas. Cutting back plant stems before flowering in late spring can help control the height of the plant. It reproduces from both seeds and horizontal, underground stems (rhizomes). It can be aggressive and is best divided every two to three years to control its growth.
- It attracts pollinators and can be used to control erosion on hillsides. It can be used as a ground cover when mowed regularly in sunny, naturalized, or unused areas. The remaining cut stems make walking difficult. As cut flowers, they have an excellent vase life, and when dried, they fade to a cream color and work well for everlasting bouquets. The spicily-scented green foliage and the dried flowers add color and fragrance to potpourri.

2024 Perennial Plant of the Year: Phlox 'Jeana'

- 'Jeana' is a long-blooming phlox variety. Expect a show from mid-July all the way through September.
- Even though its flowers are smaller than other garden phlox, some studies suggest that 'Jeana' may attract more butterflies than others on the market. A 2-year study from the Mt. Cuba Center in Delaware found that 'Jeana' received the most butterfly visits amongst other garden phlox varieties on trial.
- 'Jeana' is highly resistant to powdery mildew and exceptionally cold-hardy. This phlox can literally handle nearly any environmental condition thrown its way.
- The foliage on 'Jeana' phlox looks great nearly any season, with sturdy green stems that look clean during winter/spring and turn to a vibrant pink/purple color come summer.

2024 Proven Winners Perennial of the Year: Salvia 'Pink Profusion'

This *Salvia nemorosa* hybrid will impress you with the number of times it reblooms! Sheer back the spent flowers and enjoy again throughout the summer. Dark pink flowers are produced on darker pink calyxes on a perfectly rounded, dense and beautiful habit. This shorter stature *Salvia* will tuck in nicely to all sorts of places in your perennial garden, planted en mass makes a perfect edger.

Artemisia 'Silver Lining'

- A hybrid of native North American species including *Artemisia ludoviciana*. 'Silver Lining' finds the best in its parentage as a spectacular, durable foliage perennial. Broadly dissected silver leaves are showy from spring to fall. The mounded, low wide habit maintains perfect form all season and resists opening up. Use this perennial as a filler in the landscape and spiller in mixed containers. Buff yellow flowers are held on tall scapes. Flowering is not significant and this plant should be considered primarily for its foliage.
- Compared to the annualized types of *Artemisia*, 'Silver Lining' is truly perennial and will have exceptional performance year after year. Unlike *A. ludoviciana*, 'Silver Lining' will not take over your landscape as it does not spread by underground runners.

'Periwinkle Popsicle'

- This upright dark blue Baptisia is perfect for filling space in the landscape. The habit is taller than it is wide, with an elegant vase shape perfect for underplanting. 'Periwinkle Popsicle' is later to flower than most Baptisia, not showing color until most other varieties are finishing bloom. Compared with the light blue DECADENCE® DELUXE 'Blue Bubbly', 'Periwinkle Popsicle' blooms a dark shade of blue.
- Baptisia is easy to grow and will thrive with little maintenance. There are many potential applications in the landscape including meadow plantings, as a backdrop in borders, or as a specimen. Plants are very long-lived once established.
- The roots of the DECADENCE® series run deep. What started as a fun botanizing trip in the lower Midwest with a fellow horticulturist blossomed into a complex hybridizing project for breeder Hans Hansen. Hans has made countless crosses with the many native Baptisia species he has collected across Texas and Oklahoma. These crosses have resulted in an array of seedlings with unique flower colors and plant habits, the best of which are introduced into the DECADENCE® Series.

Baptisia 'Grape Escape'

- An elegant Baptisia with long dusky purple flower spikes. Showy cream keels accent each individual flower. 'Grape Escape' takes the place of 'Grape Taffy' in our catalog, being taller, more floriferous, and having deeper red-purple tones to the flowers.
- Baptisia is easy to grow and will thrive with little maintenance. There are many potential applications in the landscape including meadow plantings, as a backdrop in borders, or as a specimen.

Bergenia 'Spring Fling' Pigsqueak

Clematis 'Stand by Me Pink'

- The latest companion to 'Stand By Me' Bush Clematis; varying from the original with pink flowers instead of blue. Compared with traditional vining clematis, 'Stand By Me Pink' is completely herbaceous and will restart from the ground each year. Flowers will appear profusely beginning in late spring, peaking in early summer, and continuing to show color until fall. Attractive cream thread-like seed heads follow. Broad, green foliage. This plant benefits from staking, cages, or neighboring plants for support.

Delphinium 'Red Lark'

- A uniquely colored Delphinium that must be seen to be believed! Coral-red flowers are held just above the foliage at a modest 2½' tall. This variety is produced from tissue culture and has perfect uniformity compared with seed strains. Stem length and branching makes them perfect for use as a cut flower. Foliage is glossy dark green.
- Delphinium are a classic garden perennial. These plants are excellent for adding height to small spaces. Their tall flower spikes are easily recognizable when they come into flower in summer. When in flower, the spikes of these plants become heavy and should be staked to avoid toppling over in rough weather, especially taller varieties. Newer hybrids are longer lived than some of the more traditional cultivars.

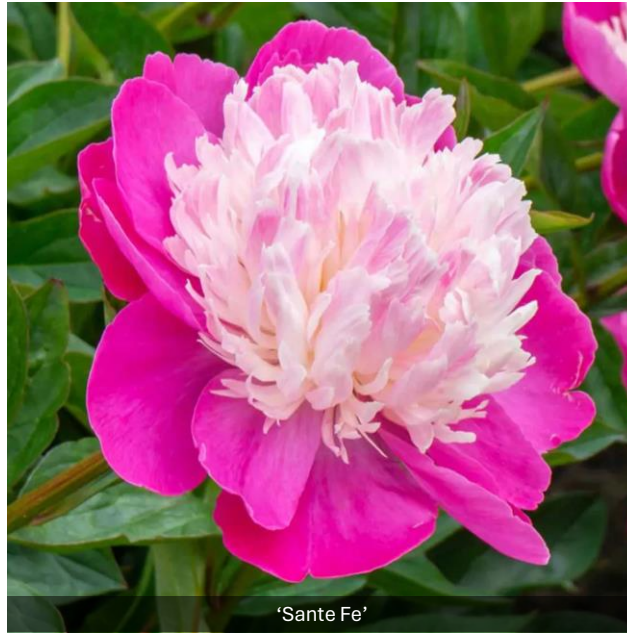

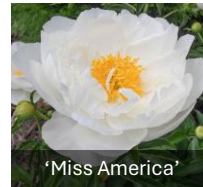

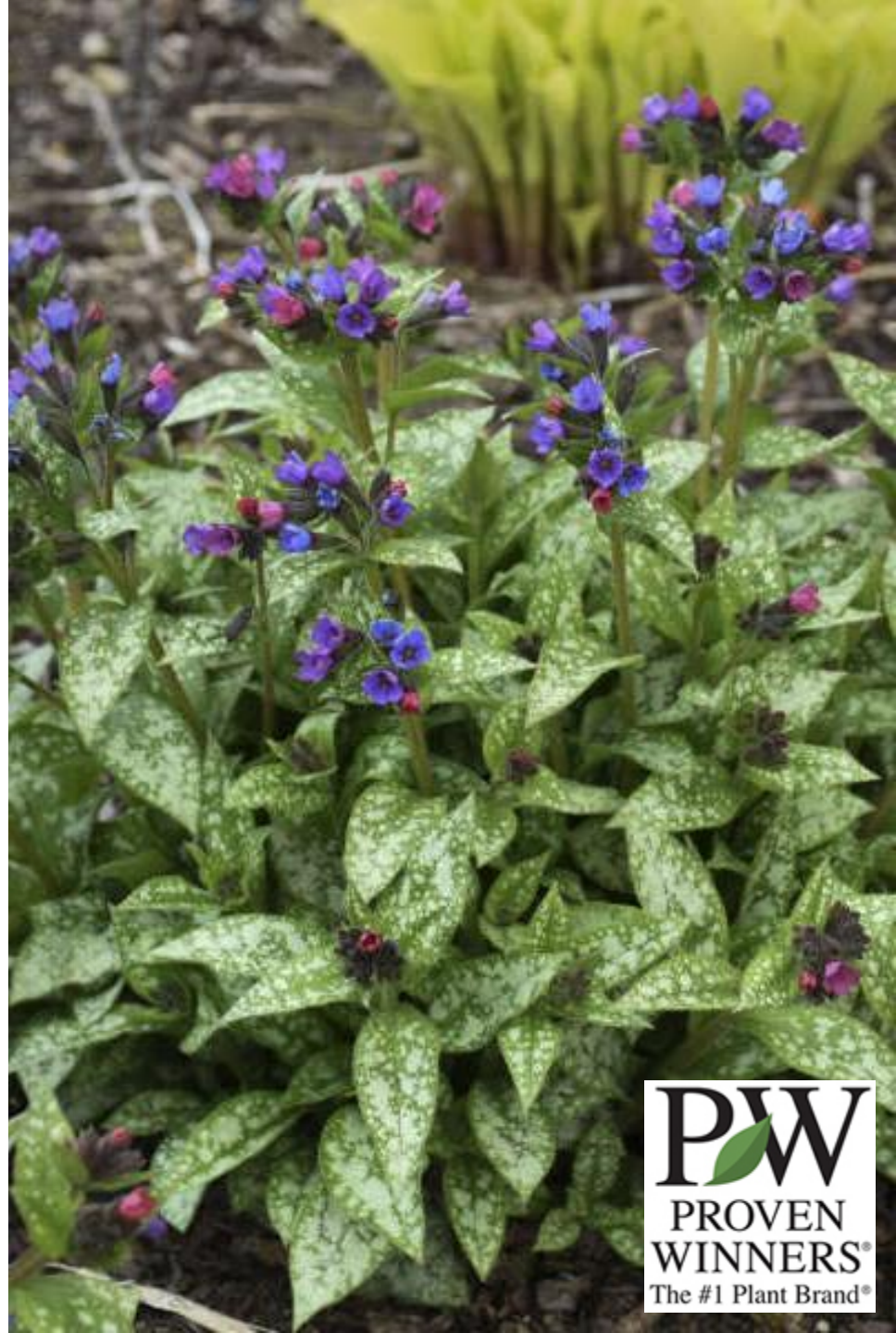
