Dormant Bare Root Plants - Conditions of Sale

- Sales period of bare root plants is generally from Mid-April thru Mid-May
- Items are of grade and true to type (as well as can be known)
- No mail order sales
- Customer pick-up required (shipment by our truck within region may be arranged)
- All sales paid with cash, VISA, MasterCard, Discover or approved check
- Sales tax will be applied unless appropriate documentation is on file
- Availability is subject to prior sale, ability to hold stock dormant, and crop condition
- Remember that bare root material is a very successful, inexpensive way to plant, however it is only available during a short window in the spring and you must be ready to pick-up your selections and plant them as soon as possible after you take charge of them.

Hanson's Garden Village Guarantee

- Survivability of plants is GUARANTEED under the following conditions:
 - We are satisfied that prudent care was provided (i.e. planted in a timely manner, watered adequately, protected from damage)
 - It can be demonstrated that a means of regular watering was available
 - The loss was not due to deer, rabbit, insects or similar damage beyond our control
 - The guarantee period includes the current growing season up to October 1st.
- The guarantee allows for, at your choice, one of the following remedies:
 - Replacement with the same type of plant the following spring, if available
 - Deduction of the bare root price paid off a similar potted tree or shrub
- **Dead woody plants must be uprooted and returned to us by October 1st of the year planted, with original tag attached and presentation of a receipt**

Recommendations for Bareroot Planting

- Thank you for buying bare root trees and shrubs from Hanson's Garden Village, LLC. You have made a wise choice. A bare root selection offers affordability, ease of transport, and great selection. Follow the instructions carefully and look forward to enjoying your plants for years to come.
- Soak plants in water augmented with a root stimulator for a few hours or overnight before planting. Do not let roots dry out. Do not soak for more than 24 hours.
- Dig a large enough hole so the roots of your specimen are not crowded. This would also be the time to mix in any compost or soil amendments, if needed, with the soil from the hole. Trim damaged roots, or roots that will not fit into the hole.
- Create a small mound at the bottom of the hole. Place the plant on top of the mound and spread the roots out evenly. Adjust the depth of the hole if necessary. Look for a stain line on the stem to judge planting depth.
- Back fill soil, perhaps adding a slow release fertilizer package. Create a shallow basin around the stem, water and mulch. The root stimulator water used for soaking may be used to water the plant.
- Check plants regularly for water and be patient as they adjust to their new location. Some plants take a while to leaf out. Water frequently at first.
- A winter tree wrap is recommended to protect young trees from rodents and winter sun, put on in fall – remove in warm weather.
