Bare Root Shrubs

Canada Serviceberry – *Pots Only 2016* *Amelanchier canadensis*

Erect shrub that spreads by means of sucker growth from the base. Flowers are snowy white and bloom early before foliage appears. The red-purple fruit is edible.

Glossy Black Chokeberry *Aronia melanocarpa var. elata*

A splendid ornamental shrub. White flowers in May followed by 1/4" black fruits that hang on well into winter. Aronia berries can be eaten fresh, used for baking, jams, juice and wine.

Gray Dogwood

Cornus racemosa

An easy to grow, hardy shrub. Lovely clusters of white berries on red stalks with gray stems. A good shrub for background or naturalized plantings. Our seed source comes exclusively from Minnesota to ensure superior hardiness. Sun or light shade.

Ivory Halo[®] Dogwood

Cornus alba 'Bailhalo'

This compact selection of variegated dogwood provides beautiful variegated foliage in summer and attractive red twigs in winter. Its finer textured, fuller, more compact form lends itself to use in smaller planting areas.

American Hazelnut

Corylus americana

Rounded edible nuts 1/2 inch wide and 2 to 4 in a cluster. Useful for the shrub border and in naturalistic settings. Sun or partial shade.

Dwarf Bush Honeysuckle

Diervilla lonicera

Excellent for mass plantings and slopes. Foliage is free of disease and insect problems. Small yellow flowers in late spring or early summer. Does well in sandy and dry soils. Very hardy.

Grove Dwarf Burning Bush

Euonymus alatus 'Grove Compactus'

The wings are more pronounced and the habit is mounded and compact rather than upright. Versatile enough to use as a hedge, screen, en masse, in borders and is pretty enough for a specimen plant. 'Grove Compactus' will tolerate shade, but should be planted in sun for the most dramatic fall color.

Gold Cluster™ Forsythia

Forsythia 'Courtaneur'

Meadowlark Forsythia

Forsythia 'Meadowlark'

A shrub with superior flower-bud hardiness and showy, bright yellow spring flowers, its flower buds are hardy to - 35°F. It will perform best in full sun.

Witch Hazel

Hamamelis virginiana

Flowers have fragrant, yellow, ribbon-like petals, 1.5" in diameter and bloom in late fall about the time leaves drop. Does well in woods, shade and naturalized situations. In full sun and good soil will develop into a well rounded vase-shaped plant. Use in the shrub border or as screen plant.

White Diamonds® Hydrangea

Hydrangea paniculata 'HYPMAD I'

With a commanding presence in the summer and fall garden, White Diamonds® is an exceptional new compact hydrangea with glistening white panicles that are held upright and eventually fade to parchment and pink for dried arrangements. Smaller and more manageable than most H. paniculata, White Diamonds® boasts dark green leathery foliage that displays increased heat and drought tolerance. Use as an anchor in the mixed border, plant as a hedge, or in a large grouping for a magnificent effect.

The habit is more upright and compact than its parent 'Pink Diamond', and with a height of just 4-5' there will be room for this beauty in any garden. Bred by Dr. Michael Dirr at the University of Georgia and introduced by Bailey Nurseries.

Bloomstruck® Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'PIIHM-II' PPAF

Bloomstruck, the newest addition to the Endless Summer Collection, lives up to the promise of Endless Blooms, and then some. This reblooming mophead flowers on old and new wood and has perfectly rounded flowers averaging 3.5 - 5" across. The intense rose-pink, violet or blue flower heads are held upright on striking red-purple stems. Flowers are violet-blue to blue in acidic soil. Glossy dark green leaves with red petioles and red veins add to this plant's retail presence and make it stand out before flowers ever open.

The flowers are held upright on strong stems, and continue to grow and lengthen as they bloom. This early blooming variety has already won the Gold Floral award for best novelty plant, and is an undeniable asset to any small garden.

In autumn the blooms display shades of pink, burgundy and green. Excellent vigor and floriferous blooming. Prefers loamy, moist, well-drained soil in sun or part shade. Flowers on new wood so it can be pruned in winter or early spring. Hybridized by Pieter Zwijnenburg, Jr. Rarely to never fed on by Japanese beetles. 2006 Gold Medal Plant Award.

Comparable to Pinky Winky™, however the habit is more upright and the red flower color persists longer. Excellent for fresh cut and dried flower arrangements. Introduced by Bailey Nurseries.



A clone of *S. canadensis* selected for its large fruit by William W. Adams of Union Springs, NY. Fruit set is normally improved when more than one cultivar is used, such as 'York'.

Developed by Neal Holland of Sheyenne Gardens in North Dakota, this compact lilac is the result of crosses made between Syringa meyeri 'Palibin' and Syringa microphylla 'Superba'. It exhibits a growth habit and bloom time similar to Dwarf Korean, but with a pleasing, spicy fragrance and incredible wine-red flower buds that open to pink.


